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The younger students were able to make beautiful turkey crowns that they cut and pasted out of paper!



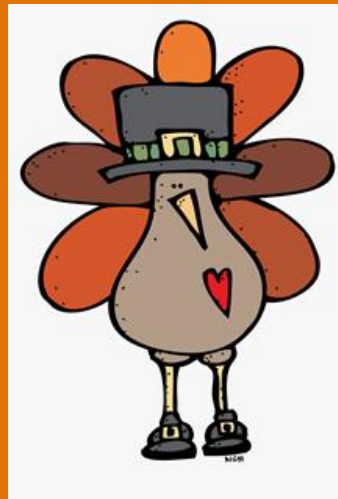
