








### International Women's Day - 8th March





### Science Projects - Year 1 - Parts of a Plant

The Year 1 classes have been working on a science project in their classrooms. Year one have been learning about the different parts of a plant and created a colourful poster of a flower labelling all the different parts: roots, stem, leaves and flower.

### <u>Science Projects – Year 1 – The Weather</u>

The Year 1 classes have also been working on another science project in their classrooms. This time, a science project about the weather. The students made a weather wheel, featuring sunny, cloudy, rainy and snowy, stormy and windy. After they made their weather wheel, they played a game where the teacher told them a weather symbol and, in pairs, they had to look it up at the wheel and point to it.

#### Science Projects - Year 2 - Animal kingdom

The Year 2 classes have been working on a science projects in their classrooms. They have been looking at the different animal groups; mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians and fish and their characteristics. They have also been learning the differences between vertebrates and invertebrates too! The students made posters of an animal that fits into each category, i.e. mammal was a cow, and wrote some of the characteristics that they possess. The finished posters were put up on the wall of the classroom.

### Saint Patrick's Day Celebrations - 17th March - Online Activity

As stated in the introduction of the blog, due to the Coronavirus outbreak, some bilingual activities have been taught online and given activities for the children to do at home! Saint Patrick's Day is a very famous holiday celebrated on the 17<sup>th</sup> March. It was founded in Ireland and it's even celebrated in Spain.

Auxiliar Yasmin had prepared a worksheet for the children to carry out online and at home. The activity included a brief introduction regarding the history of Saint Patrick's Day and then a short cartoon video with subtitles explaining the history further.

After learning about the history, we looked at some of the famous symbols of St. Patricks Day, namely the shamrock, leprechaun and pot of gold and then the students could watch a short cartoon video about a leprechaun trying to find his pot of gold. This video incorporated these symbols so the students could see how they could be used.

After this, there are songs to which the students can sing along to again reinforce the vocabulary for the younger years and they also included counting leprechauns doing an action to revise the numbers and different action verbs.

The students could also play several online games that were St. Patrick themed, including a word search, a memory game, hangman, join the dots and fill the shapes. The different games applied to different years groups to revise specific St. Patrick vocabulary, numbers, letters, shapes and to test their memory!

Finally, there were three different crafts the students could choose to do at home. They could make a leprechaun stick puppet, leprechaun hats and/or shamrock men.

### Spring Activities – 21st March – Online Activity

Spring is starting this month!! The start of a new season brings some exciting new activities to do.

The bilingual team have created some fun springtime activities to do online and at home. The activity included a brief introduction about spring and what spring involves, i.e. the months, Easter, the weather and the animals. There is also a short video, one for years 1-3 and another for years 4-6, explaining spring further with subtitles.

Then there is a vocabulary sheet including typical spring words: the birds, flowers, insects etc. After this, there are some poems about spring. The students can read them to see if they can spot the rhyming words.

It's story time! There are different videos telling a story featuring spring, one for years 1-3 and another for years 4-6. The stories reinforce some of the springtime vocabulary that they have learnt in context. Once story time is over, there is a page of songs starting easy and getting harder as you go down the list. The students can learn to sing along to each one learning about different spring themes, a fun interactive way to learn more vocabulary.

After singing some songs, the students could also play several online games that were spring themed, including a word search, a number memory game, a picture memory game, hangman, join the dots and a spot the difference. The different games applied to different years groups to revise specific spring vocabulary, numbers, letters, to test their observational skills and to test their memory!

Finally, there were three different crafts and colouring pages the students could choose to do at home. They could make different flowers or insects and could colour in the Easter eggs by following the number key.
